❖ High School Course Description

All high school classes are honors level (exception-Algebra I and House)

All RECHS students follow the University Prep pathway

All students begin taking community college courses their first semester

College tuition is without cost to parents during the regular school year

Ninth Grade Year: Algebra I or Geometry; Earth and Environmental

English 1; World History

Tenth Grade Year: Geometry or Algebra II; Biology

English II; Civics and Economics

Eleventh Grade Year: Algebra II or College level math; Chemistry

English III; U.S. History

Twelfth Grade Year: English IV- Graduation Project

❖ College Course Description

Students may take one or more college courses during each semester

College courses are chosen on an individual basis

Ninth grade students are able to choose from five college courses

Tenth grade students are able to choose from more than 20 college courses

Approximately 14 college classes are required to earn a high school diploma.

80% of all attempted classes resulted in a "C" or higher.

❖ Accomplishments

During the 2009-2010 school year, 97.3% of RECHS students were proficient in English I; 91.8% were proficient in Geometry; 90.4% were proficient in Biology; 92.6% were proficient in Civics; 93% were proficient in Algebra I and 88.5% were proficient in Algebra II.

❖ Transportation

If a student needs bus transportation, a bus will leave the five high school sites (SWRHS, RHS, THS, ERHS, and PGHS) between 8:00 a.m. and 8:15 a.m. each morning and return at approximately 5:00 p.m. each evening. Students may choose any mode of transportation to arrive at the high school or hub site (individual, parent, or established bus route). However, students and/or parents must provide transportation home once they arrive at the assigned hub site in the evening. Transportation from the hub site will travel only direct roadways to the RCC campus. It

is possible to request that these buses make passenger stops during the morning or evening schedules at designated landmarks located along these direct routes. The bus transportation system will not allow for passenger stops other than the ones noted above. Requests for such stops will be considered and the final decision will be the responsibility of the RCS Director of Transportation.

❖ **Meals**

Students will have the option of bringing their lunch, participating in the federal school lunch program (purchasing lunch from SWRHS) or purchasing lunch from the Armadillo Café.

❖ **Additional Opportunities**

Each student is required to participate in community service. The number of service hours is specific to their grade level.

House/Teen Leadership Class, academic labs, after-school tutoring, RCC writing lab, Campus Cruiser email accounts, SmartThinking online tutoring, RCC writing lab, and cultural events.

❖ **Expectations**

Randolph Early College High School has a relentless academic focus.

We are primarily an academic school and our goal is to help each student become college ready.

Students should expect between 2.5 and 3 hours of homework per night.

❖ **Who Should Apply?**

Students who are eager for an academically challenging program of study.

Students who are highly responsible.

Students who possess the maturity to handle extended independence.

Students with a strong desire to succeed.

❖ **Personal Maturity and Responsibility**

Students are accepted into RECHS with the understanding that they will adopt and exhibit a serious attitude toward their classes, their learning, and their academic preparation for college and the workplace. For that reason, RECHS students must assume a much greater level of personal responsibility for themselves, their safety, and the results of their decisions. Parents must support and encourage this as well.

❖ **Campus Movement: Monitoring and Supervision**

The RCC campus is a very busy college campus with people coming and going all day at all times. Likewise, RECHS students must move around the campus from class to class and elsewhere as needed. During the scheduled breaks, meal times, and the occasional cancelled class, there are opportunities for students to be without direct supervision. The RECHS Team will exercise reasonable levels of supervision and oversight, but specific continuous monitoring and supervision of all students, as found on typical high school campuses, is impossible.
